

To Kill a Mockingbird- Harper Lee, 1960




As a Southern Gothic novel and a *Bildungsroman*, the primary themes of *To Kill a Mockingbird* involve racial injustice and the destruction of innocence. Scholars have noted that Lee also addresses issues of class, courage, compassion, and gender roles in the American Deep South.

The Help- Kathryn Stockett, 2009



Harry Potter- J.K. Rowling, 1997-2007




Themes such as normality, oppression, survival, and overcoming imposing odds have all been considered as prevalent throughout the series. Similarly, the theme of making one's way through adolescence and "going over one's most harrowing ordeals- and thus coming to terms with them" has also been considered. Rowling has stated that the books comprise "a prolonged argument for tolerance, a prolonged plea for an end to bigotry" and that also pass on a message to "question authority and not assume that the

establishment or the press tells you all of the truth".


Hope had just about run out, but then . . . there came a scratchin' at the door and Dessa Dean's life was forever changed.
